Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance since September is 95.72%, I realise we are coming into the season of coughs and colds and sickness bugs and we have had some poorly children over the past couple of weeks with asthma and tonsillitis. As always I can only remind you of how important your child's attendance is and the difference good attendance makes to their learning.

Attendance-100% amazing-couldn't do better!

Attendance 97%-99% incredibly good, children should be very proud of this attendance

Attendance 95% - 96% hitting national attendance

Attendance 91% - 94% cause for concern

Attendance 90% and below is classed as persistent absence and steps will have to be made to improve attendance.

Advent giving

The generosity of our small school is amazing; we teach the children to be grateful and generous and loving and compassionate and the children act upon these with great kindness and generosity.

This year we are doing a couple of small things to make a difference to peoples Christmas. We are going to have boxes outside the library for Foodbank donations (a list is attached), we don't expect everyone to be able to donate but if the staff and some families donate we will be able to provide something for those less fortunate than ourselves.

We will be holding our annual Christmas Gift Night—this year we are trying something new. We are going to make decorations for our Christmas trees in school. The idea is you can donate your decoration (that you and your child make) to a person you will miss at Christmas and we can keep them in our thoughts this year. We will ask for a £1 donation and this money will go to a local charity—possibly a homeless charity or a local hospice for Christmas.

The gift night will be on Wednesday 5th December after school and you are all welcome to come in and join us. Refreshments will be on sale this year to make your experience more enjoyable!

We have also been thinking of ways to raise a little bit of money for our school fund as we will be buying some new laptops later this year for the children to use. The staff are going to put together two raffles. One will be a hamper (for adults) and these tickets will be sold on Gift Night and before all the Christmas performances. Tickets will be 50p.
