Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance since September is now 96% and I am delighted with this—last weeks attendance at school was 97.1%. I would love this to remain for the rest of the year. Thank you to all parents who have responded so well to letters and meetings and have supported their children in improving their attendance. It makes such a difference.

Attendance—100% amazing—couldn't do better!

Attendance 97%-99% incredibly good, children should be very proud of this attendance.

Attendance 95% - 96% hitting national attendance

Attendance 91% - 94% cause for concern

Attendance 90% and below is classed as persistent absence and steps will have to be made to improve attendance.

Just to confirm that all holidays will be noted as unauthorised absences from school—even if we have discussed it I am not allowed to authorise it and obviously if it takes your child's attendance for the year to below 90% then we will have to take measures to ensure improvement. Mr Wilson and I will be sending out information on the guidelines that we have to follow.

Lenten Activities and fundraising

We are now past the half way mark of our fundraising and already we have collected £1400 which is just tremendous. As I explained in my last letter the children have chosen the charities in which they want their money to go to. Year 6 and 5 have organised tremendous Lenten activities and I am looking forward to Year 4's this afternoon and Year 3's next week.

Thank you for your generosity and your willingness to support your children in their efforts.

Swimming

We are planning to try to do swimming slightly differently in the Summer Term; we want to target children who would benefit from swimming because of physical difficulties they may have. We will be contacting parents to explain why we want their child to join the sessions.

We will also start to take small groups of Year 2 children to prepare them for their swimming next year; in addition we will take some Year 6 children who would benefit from some additional lessons. We will let you know directly if your child is going to join in swimming lessons next term.
