Dinner Money Changes

There has been a slight increase from Citiserve in the prices of school dinners. The new prices affect Nursery and Key Stage 2 only and will come into effect on the first week back after Easter. The new prices are as follows:

Key Stage 2: £2.15 per day or £10.75 per week.

Nursery: £1.85 per day or £9.25 per week.

Attendance

For the first time in a long time our school attendance has **dipped below 96%**. The Governments expectation is that school attendance should be 96% or more. We have worked hard together to improve attendance and I would hate to have to become more severe with attendance.
