Prayer Garden

In the weeks since Mr Laidlaw's death I have held a couple of meetings with the team who have been planning the garden for the courtyard in school. You will remember that we had a company who came in and designed a multi-faceted garden; we held a competition for children to design a courtyard garden and we held a number of fundraising activities.

A decision was made that in response to Mr Laidlaw's death the garden should become the 'The Laidlaw Prayer or Peace Garden' and that the focus will now change to be a place of peace, prayer and rest. We are simplifying the design and making the garden a more open space with elements in which classes, groups, individuals can sit quietly and peacefully.

We want to include a flower garden, a memorial bench, a memorial for Robby, a Marian Shrine and some statues or artwork. We want the heart of the school to be a place that reflects our community and is a place of rest and comfort.

We want the garden to be open by Easter and we have planned a clearance weekend and a couple of other fundraising activities which will support the work. The Governors have agreed that the remainder of the cost can come from the school budget.

I hope you can see why we have changed the premise and purpose of the garden and wish to dedicate to both Mr and Mrs Laidlaw who were at the heart of this school for many years. I am sure over the coming weeks when I talk to the children and staff there will be numerous other ideas about how we can create this garden. I hope that you will continue to support us and that by the Summer Term we have a new place in our school that we will all be proud of.

Open Morning

If you have a child in Nursery or a child who is Nursery age and will be starting Reception in September 2017 we are holding an Open Morning next Wednesday the 9th November. This is allow you to see the school at work, once the day has begun and it gives you a chance to meet me and ask any questions you may have about your child starting this school.
