School Uniform

In recent weeks there have been a number of queries regarding school uniform requirements and in particular colours of tights, types of ear rings and hair accessories. while hair bands and bows should be small and discrete, their purpose is to tie hair back and not a fashion statement. The permitted colours are white, blue and black.

Uniform applies to all children and staff will be monitoring the situation. We really do appreciate your support on this matter.
