- Please support our school to achieve our target of 97% attendance this year. The Government are very clear in their expectations of schools to
- achieve an excellent level of attendance. Please be aware that any time
- lost will have an impact on your child's learning. We appreciate that children do become ill and have to miss school on occasion, but we do ask that if they are well enough to attend that they do attend. I must also make parents aware that we cannot authorise holidays in school term time.
