Due to the ever growing reliance we have on technology, children are now spend-

- online. I'm sure as parents you know the struggle of controlling the amount of time children spend online and are worried about how it can affect them. It is
- estimated that 75% of children now sleep with a device in their room, so control-
- ling how much time they're online can be difficult. Fortunately there is a new app designed to give parents control over how much time their children spend online;
- 2 it is called OurPact and it is free to download. OurPact gives you the power to block internet and apps across any network, inside and outside of the home.

This App can be downloaded free from Apple and Android App Stores if this is of interest to you.
