It is also the time when Year 3 and Year 6 children who will receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion or Confirmation this year are presented to the Parish.

Dropping off

A polite reminder in morning when you bring your children onto the playground you are responsible for them; although many members of staff go out they are not on duty. I made a decision, and was supported by the staff, that coming out in the morning and afternoons meant that we could see you all and spend time talking to you. Please ensure that your children do not go on the equipment and that you know were they are and you do not leave them until the bell goes. Many thanks for your support in this matter.

Food Bank Vouchers

Just a reminder to you all that the school are able to give out food vouchers. This is completely confidential and dealt with by me. If you are, or know of someone, who is struggling to buy their weekly food then please do come in and see me. I issue the vouchers and they can be used at our local foodbank which will provide around 3 days worth of food. As I have said it will all be handled confidentially.

Playgrounds, boilers and communication

As I mentioned to you in a previous letter we are having to manage our finances very carefully at the moment; I wanted to let you know that we are planning on having our playgrounds re-surfaced, as they are in need of it. I have actually applied for a grant to get this done and I am waiting to hear about it. We have a governors meeting next week in which this matter will be discussed; I ask for your patience and understanding as we work towards getting things done.

Many thanks to the Nursery staff, parents and children who spent two days in the main school this week as the Nursery boiler had to be replaced. My thanks also to Reception staff who supported the Nursery in sharing their space.

As a school we value communication and we try very hard to ensure that we see and speak to parents on a regular basis. In the course of a school day there may be some messages that are not passed on; we can only apologise for this but nothing is done intentionally. I would also ask that you trust us; we do not report every single incident to you because we may not deem it necessary to inform you.

As the Headteacher I also do ask members of my Senior Team—Mr Kelly, Mrs Hodson, Mr Wilson and Mr O'Rourke and also Mr Samuels to look into and deal with certain matters; they have full authority to do this and it is always reported back to me; indeed the reason for a Senior Team is in part to support me and the pupils in these matters.
