Attendance

Punctuality

The school bell goes at 8:55am—the children go into class and the register is taken first thing. Please try to ensure that your child gets to school on time—missing 10-15 minutes at morning can add up to over an hour of education a week which does have an impact. Please remember if your child is late it is not their fault, they rely on you to get them to school on time. I am going to start publishing how many lates occur in each class per week.

Nursery Places

If your child will be 3 years old by September 2018 then you are eligible for a Nursery place at St Cuthbert's. We have 52 part time places; some parents may be eligible under a government scheme for a full time place and we also offer self paying full time places. Please complete the forms at the main school office to register your child. We will be letting parents know very soon about Nursery places for September 2018.
